BUDGET 2016

I have listened carefully to the Budget Statement and, in particular, the parts of it that affect local government. I should be grateful if you could answer a few immediate questions that arise from the statement and the accompanying documents.

Paragraph 1.164 of the Budget says that:

Dew Grey

"Local government will be compensated for the loss of income as a result of the business rates measures above [small business rate relief, increase in the multiplier threshold, indexation to CPI and administrative changes], and the impact considered as part of the government's consultation on the implementation of 100% business rate retention in summer 2016."

Could you confirm that this means that local authorities will be compensated in full and that none of them will be worse off as a result of these measures?

I should also be grateful if you could confirm that you plan to take account of the probable longerterm reduction in business rates income for local authorities both in consideration of the additional responsibilities that are to be devolved following the move to 100% retention of business rates and in any redistribution scheme.
