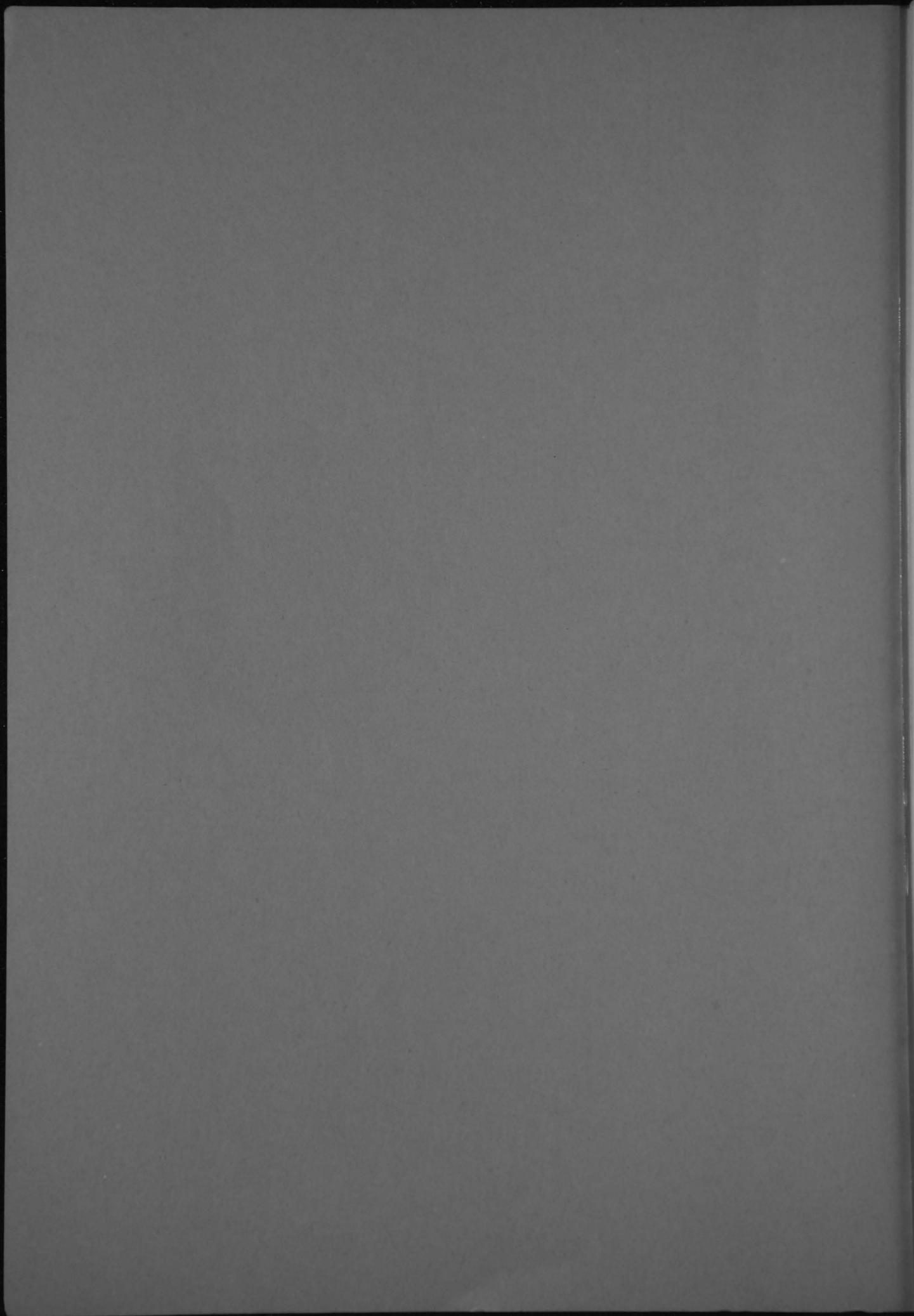

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SECTION A1

SITTINGS OF THE HOUSE AND DATES OF SESSION

The session 1983-84 was a long one owing to the calling of a General Election in June 1983.

The House sat on every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday during the following periods (all dates inclusive).

22 June 1983 - 29 July 1983
24 October 1983 - 22 December 1983
16 January 1984 - 13 April 1984
25 April 1984 - 4 May 1984
8 May 1984 - 25 May 1984
4 June 1984 - 1 August 1984
22 October 1984 - 31 October 1984

The House met also on 15, 16, 17 and 21 June 1983 for preliminary business - the election and confirmation of the Speaker, and swearing-in of Members.

The total number of sitting Days was 213 (including the swearing-in days).

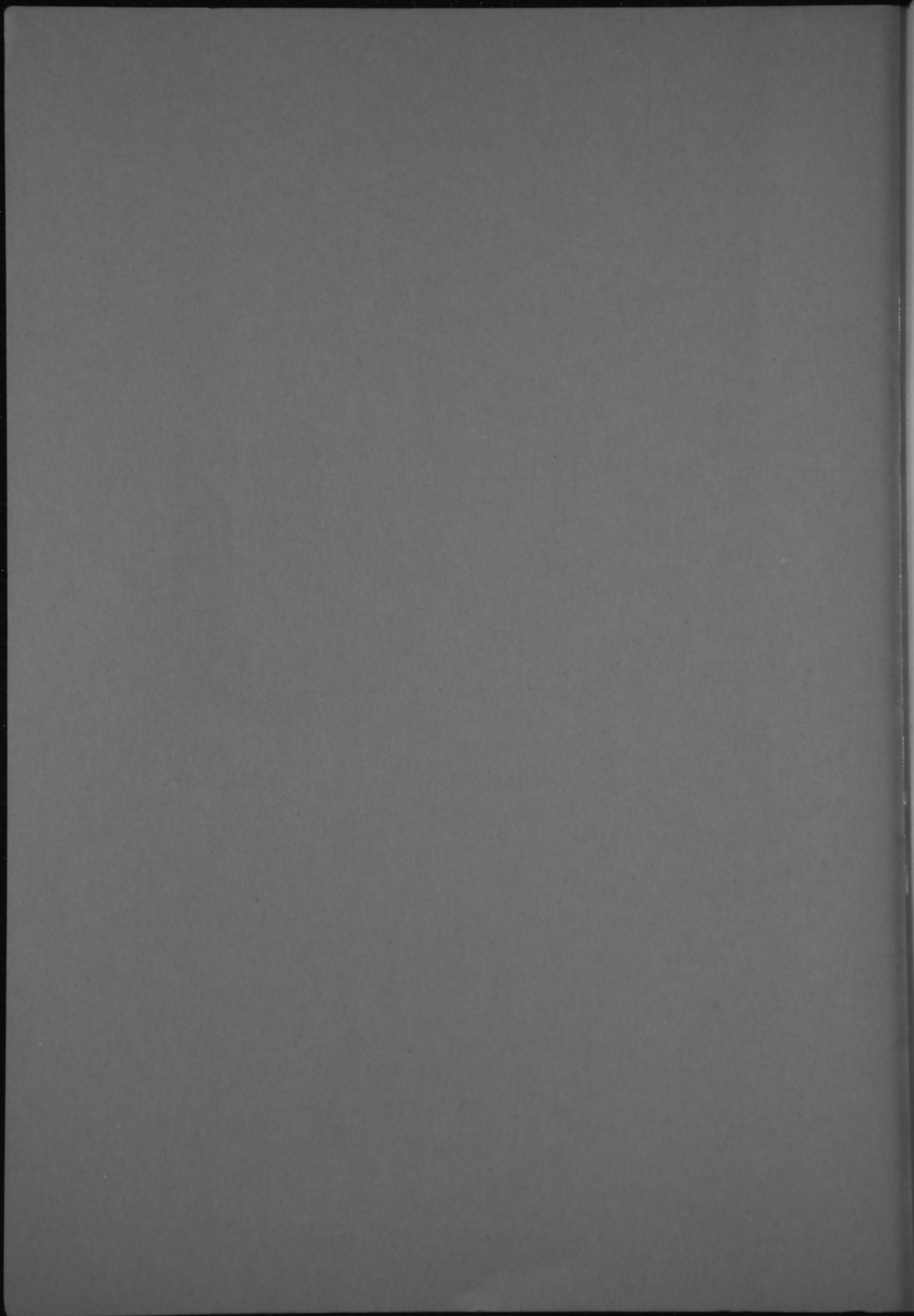
