
SESSIONAL INFORMATION DIGEST 1985–86

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INTRODUCTION

This is the third session for which a Sessional Information Digest has been prepared. It was always intended that it should be priced and published by Her Majesty's Stationery Office, following two experimental issues which were made available free of charge to Weekly Information Bulletin subscribers and other enquirers on demand.

The Digest does not replace editions of the Weekly Information Bulletin, and it is recommended that users retain their files. Although the Digest is in some ways a cumulation of information from the Weekly Information Bulletin, full bibliographical details are not given here, in order to save space. In this respect the Digest forms an index and companion to the Bulletin.

This *Digest* has been written and compiled by Pam Bozdan, and typeset by Kay Lawrie and Greta Alexander. The Public Information Office is grateful to the Journal Office of the House of Commons for providing certain unpublished data for Section A, and to Committee Clerks for checking entries relating to their Committees.


