INTRODUCTION

The following information is intended to provide a general overview of the House of Commons and its functions. It is intended to be used as a guide to the House of Commons and its members. It is not intended to be used as a substitute for the House of Commons website, House of Commons Library, or any other source of information.

## HOUSE OF COMMONS

The House of Commons is the lower house of the United Kingdom's Parliament. It is made up of members who are elected by the public. The House of Commons has the power to pass laws, to hold the government to account, and to represent the interests of the public.

The House of Commons is a democratically elected body. Its members are elected by the public in general elections. The House of Commons is responsible for the day-to-day running of the government and for the passage of laws.
